


Ulcombe Parish Council - Call for Sites Questionnaire


Q1 Please state your primary relationship with Ulcombe parish.*


Q2 Ulcombe has had limited development in the last 30 years. Would you like, in principle, to see more development in Ulcombe over the coming decade?*


Q3 On what sort of scale would you wish to see development?

Q4 What kind of development would you prefer (please select all that apply)?






Q5 If a development were to provide funding for community facilities (e.g. community centre, shop, improved internet connections) would you be more likely to support such a development?*


Q6 If development were to be approved in Ulcombe would you prefer to see such development next to the existing village or elsewhere within the parish?*




Q8 Where did you view the proposals?

Site one has been left unattended for many years. As a result re-wilding has occured with many trees, increased bird levels including owls, small mammals including bats plus slow worms, adders etc. I believe the development of this site will have a significant determental impact on the environment.

Ulcombe has a poor infrustructure in terms of road, public transport connects and other facilities and therefore any development would only put further strain on this. It is also not in line with government and council policies under climate change with new housing envitably leading to more cars/traffic for communting and therefore a determintal impact on the residents of the village and the environment. My view is that development should be focused around hubs that have good infrustructure in place.

The proposed community element of this plan, while understandable, is not realistiic. The current village hall is already under utilised. Shops and cafes are unlikley to get the adequate foot fall to enable it to succeed unless the village approves significant larger developments such as that proposed under Site 3. There is also no guarantee on the type of outlets that will move in and clearly not all would have any direct benefit to the local community. Also noted that the parking planned seems disproportionate to the size of the village.

The sewage system runs under site 1 and will need significant work. This already often has issued and we have had flooding in the field behind the houses in chestnut close due to breaches on several occassions over the last couple of years.

The Reservoir in the field adjasent to this site should be consider. It would appear the development runs close to this and therefore would assume there is some level of risk.

Regular flooding in Eastwood road when driving past, it can only get worse with fields of tarmac and concrete sloping towards the dip and rise of water level from climate change. Its just about lining a few field owners pockets but creating many extra cars a day on tiny lanes plus years of extra lorries during building.

This is a small village with very limited infrastructure, the traffic at school times is hectic to say the least, the surrounding roads are very narrow and unable to sustain further traffic movements, also this is a high flood risk area.

East Wood road regularly floods with water pouring out of the fields. Also sustainability with in the village, roads not wide enough to sustain traffic demand. Lack of parking with the average 2 cars per family.

The flooding in Eastwood Rd would be severely increased.

The development is unsustainable as every house would need at-least 2 cars.

Saturday, February 29, 2020, 12:47 PM UTC

This is the obvious place for village expansion, being limited by The Street to the west and Eastwood Road to the south. This is the natural infill space which would easily have room for 25 houses, plus a village centre or amenity of some sort (village shop, tea room etc), and still allow a generous strip of land for a hedge/wilding etc. It also has excellent choices for access eg not on bends.

Saturday, February 22, 2020, 7:58 PM UTC

I support the development being adjacent to the existing village, and this site seems ideal being next to the most recent development in the village. I strongly support the proposal to include a community facility. Ideally this would be a shop.

Friday, February 21, 2020, 4:04 PM UTC

The village is unable to take anymore vehicular traffic through it. Speeds and volume of traffic are unacceptable in such a narrow road with a school and properties so close to the road, and no traffic calming measures in place. Further development, either residential or community services will only add to this.

Whilst I do not see that any development in the Parish will bring benefits to the existing residents (eg sufficient extra business to support a shop or more frequent bus services), I do accept that Ulcombe may have to take its share of the extra housing the MBC apparently has to provide. That being the case, site 1 seems the most logical location. It is bounded on 3 sides by existing roads with residential housing on them and would be a natural in-fill.

Friday, January 31, 2020, 4:49 PM UTC

This answer is based on the impact such development would have on us personally. We moved into Chestnut Close in 2004 and Site 1 is at the back of our house. We moved here specifically for the quiet, darkness and accessibility to the countryside.

Over the last few years the change in farming practice around the village has led to a decrease in wildlife habitats (so many hedgerows have been destroyed). Site 1 has been left undisturbed for at least seven years and is now establishing itself as woodland. We have always been able to hear/see foxes, birds and bats in our garden or in Site 1, but never to the extent that we have since they stopped farming the site. The proposed development would make this a place where we would not wish to live. Our wider comments on the development proposal are set out in the response to Q14.





The village is surrounded by housing developments in Langley, Lenham and Headcorn. There must be some areas left for people who do not wish to live in towns. We would like Ulcombe to be such an area. We see no evidence of additional house requirement in Ulcombe. Property is not selling quickly and we know of two neighbours who marketed their houses and had no interest in the past year.

Traffic in and through the village would increase. The roads from Headcorn through to the A20 are already in a poor state of repair. Speeding traffic is already a hazard to villagers and the school children. At a time when planners should be moving away from car dependent developments it beggars belief that these sites are even under consideration. Promises of better public transport are wishful thinking. Acknowledging that the construction period is only temporary (however long that may be) We cannot imagine how construction traffic will get safely to any of the sites. Down Ulcombe Hill and pass the school?

We have heard it said that Ulcombe needs a community centre (what is wrong with the existing village hall?), a shop (everyone in the village I have spoken to either shop on-line or go to the supermarket on their way home from work. We cannot see a shop surviving long on providing the occasional bottle of milk) or a meeting place/restaurant (not sure the pub will survive with or without the competition). The whole idea seems a folly.

I have consistently objected to further development in the area on 2 grounds: environmental impact and lack of infrastructure capacity (specifically road traffic); our roads are oused and under-maintained and having heavy goods vehicles, heavy plant/machinery and construction traffic and works for a prolonged period of time, potentially making access to and from the village from the south, is a huge concern. It is all too easy to become trapped with only one way in and out.

My further objections to this proposal are as follows:

- 1. This is a greenfield site and should not be built on at this time; it is agricultural land and should be protected as such
- 2. This development appears to be higher density than other proposals; it is suggested that there could be 30 houses on the first hectare.
- 3. As this site is 4.4 hectares it raises a real concern that, once the first tranche is completed, a further 3 proposals will be made taking the expansion of the village up to 120 additional houses. This is a massive change to the nature of the area and would potentially lead to significant issues in terms of impact on services and road use. Furthermore, the proposal makes clear there could be higher density building than even the dwellings proposed. This will fundamentally affect quality of life in the village and will change its character entirely.
- 4. The proposed shop, I have been led to believe, is outside the landowner's power to authorise and is unlikely to be approved. This means the very small community benefit being suggested is unsupported.
- 5. The benefit to the school is unclear and should not be assumed
